**INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY**

The Fund, operating as a Fund-of-Funds, seeks to achieve long-term capital growth by investing in a diversified portfolio of global equity and fixed income collective investment schemes which integrate environmental, social, and governance in its process, investment criteria the of incorporation including sustainability goals and facilitation of flow of funds towards green economic activities, climate change mitigation and projects, and other adaptation positive environmental and social impact initiatives.

**CLIENT SUITABILITY**

A client profiling process shall be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust/Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, before deciding to invest.

The BPI Sustainable Global Balanced Fund-of-Funds is for investors who:

- Are at least classified as aggressive based on their risk profile.
- Have an investment horizon of at least five (5) years.

Participation in the Fund shall be open to Participants with legal capacity to contract and who are not considered US persons under the US securities and tax laws, subject to the other conditions, rules or provisions stated in the Plan Rules and those established by the Trustee. No beneficial owner shall hold more than 10% of the Fund. Any investor who owns more than 10% shall be asked to redeem the amount (or its equivalent number of units) in excess of 10% within thirty (30) calendar days.

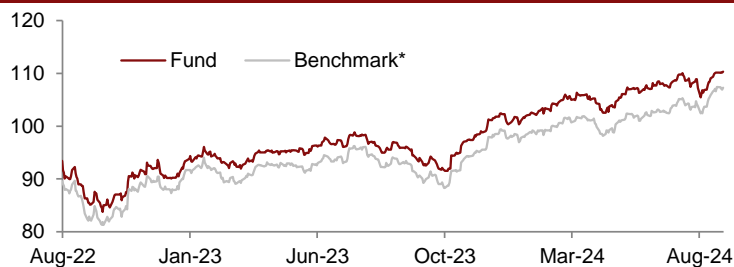

## OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

**Market Review.** Global equities posted positive returns in August with the MSCI All Country World Index returning 2.6%. In the US, the S&P 500 declined as much as 7.0% at the beginning of the month amid a massive unwinding of the Yen carry trade and weak labor data as July non-farm payrolls disappointed, posting at 114,000 versus expected 175,000 jobs, and unemployment rate rose to 4.3%. Later in the month, more reassuring data helped the market rebound as retail sales rose above expectations, and the S&P 500 ended the month up by 2.4%. In terms of monetary policy, Federal Reserve Chair Jerome Powell signaled in the Jackson Hole meeting that a rate cut in September will be likely as inflation has continued to trend down to the central bank’s 2.0% target. Outside of the US, the MSCI Europe Index returned 1.5%. Annual inflation fell from 2.9% in June to 2.1% in July, increasing the likelihood of another rate cut during the European Central Bank’s September meeting. The Eurozone Composite and Services PMI remained in expansionary territory after the 2024 Olympic Games boosted business activity. Japanese equities experienced volatility in August after a sharp appreciation of the Yen versus the dollar triggered the unwinding of the Yen carry trade. This led to the largest decline of the Japanese equities market in 37 years before rebounding, with the TOPIX ending the month at -2.9%. The Japanese economy continues to grow supported by domestic demand as GDP growth grew by 0.8% in the second quarter. Emerging market equities posted positive returns with the MSCI Emerging Market Index returning 1.6% for the month as the US dollar weakened from Federal Reserve Chair Powell’s dovish sentiment.

Within the fixed income space, global fixed income markets saw positive returns in August with the Bloomberg Global Aggregate Bond Index returning 2.4%. Investors focused on the anticipated interest rate cuts by the US Federal Reserve after Federal Reserve Chair Jerome Powell comment in the Jackson Hole meeting that a rate cut in September will be likely after weaker employment and softer inflation data. This caused the US yield curve to steepen over the month with the 2-year, 10-year, and 30-year yields falling 34, 13, and 11 basis points, ending the month at 3.9%, 3.9%, and 4.2%, respectively. Credit outperformed government bonds as positive economic data releases helped soften recession fears and drove spreads to tighten towards the end of the month. Global investment-grade, global high-yield and emerging-market debt ended the month at 1.9%, 2.2%, and 2.1%, respectively.

**Fund Performance.** The fund returned 1.29%, underperforming the benchmark by 114 basis point. Security selection within the fund detracted from performance.

**Fund Strategy.** We expect major structural trends in sustainability, such as increasing market share of electric vehicles and record installation of wind turbines and solar panels, to continue. The ongoing Russia-Ukraine war, has resulted in the world, particularly Europe, determined to reduce their reliance on traditional sources of energy such as oil in gas, requiring large investments in renewable energy in the coming years. In addition, we continue to see support for green technologies through government policies across the globe. We believe that strong ESG companies are likely to generate positive financial performance over time as investing in sustainability can deliver higher growth and returns through innovation, higher operational efficiency and better risk management.

The Target Fund must be recognized as a collective investment scheme in its home jurisdiction by a regulatory authority or any regulatory authority acceptable to the BSP to supervise this CIS.
